

**High School Graduates, “a-g” Completers,
and California Public College/University Enrollment Report: 2004-06**

This report provides the following data about students from Hiram W. Johnson High School:

- Section I provides data about Hiram W. Johnson High School graduates and the number of graduates who completed the University of California (UC)/California State University (CSU) “a-g” coursework requirements, which are described at www.ucop.edu/a-gGuide/ag/a-g/welcome.html. These data can answer questions like “What percentage of the graduates were Latino?” and “How many of the female graduates met the ‘a-g’ requirements?”
- Section II provides data about enrollment in California public colleges and universities statewide for Hiram W. Johnson High School students. With these data, you can answer questions like “Approximately how many of the graduates are enrolled as freshmen in California public colleges and universities statewide?” and “Among those enrolled, what percentage are enrolled in UC?”
- Section III provides local college/university enrollment data for Hiram W. Johnson High School students. These data can answer questions like “Of those enrolled statewide, how many are enrolled locally?” and “Among those enrolled locally, how many go to a specific local campus?”

The data used to create this report were obtained from the California Postsecondary Education Commission (CPEC) Web site (www.cpec.ca.gov) on September 17, 2007. Data are provided by ethnic and gender groups for the three most recent years for which data are available.¹ Because CPEC updates all of its data at least annually, the data provided in this report may differ from the data provided for the same year in a prior report.

When reviewing these data, please keep in mind the following characteristics of the data:

- The graduation and “a-g” completion data, by ethnicity, are obtained by CPEC from the California Department of Education’s California Basic Educational Data System (CBEDS). These data are reported at the school level.
- The college/university enrollment data, with enrollees’ ethnicity and high school of origin, are collected by CPEC from the University of California, California State University, and California Community Colleges. These data are reported at the individual student level.
- CPEC uses a college/university enrollee’s high school of origin to link that student to his/her high school. This information, however, may be missing or inaccurate in the CPEC database due to errors in the data collection process.
- The ethnicity data collected at the K-12 level may differ from those data at the college/university level. Parents/guardians typically report a student’s ethnic data for the K-12 system, but students typically self-report (or decline to report) that information when enrolling in a college/university.
- Students may enroll in a community college without having graduated from high school, and a high school graduate may take a year (or more) off before enrolling in a college/university.
- For these reasons, it can not be assumed that the college/university students for whom data are reported in Table 2 are a perfect subset of the high school students for whom data are reported in Table 1. Because of this, the percentages reported in Table 2, computed by dividing the number of college/university enrollees by the number of graduates reported in Table 1, must be considered an approximate college-going rate.
- The college/university enrollment data are for California public institutions only. Students who enroll at a California private college/university or at an institution in another state are not included.

Section I
High School Graduates and “a-g” Coursework Completers

Table 1 shows high school graduation and UC/CSU “a-g” coursework completion data for students in Hiram W. Johnson High School. For each year and group, the table provides (a) the number of high school graduates, (b) the percentage of all graduates the group represents, and (c) the number and percentage of graduates who completed the “a-g” coursework requirements. For example, in 2003-04 there were 162 Asian/Pacific Islander graduates, who made up 38.4% of all graduates, and 37 (22.8%) of the Asian/Pacific Islander graduates completed the “a-g” coursework requirements.

NOTES. CPEC obtains these data from the California Department of Education’s California Basic Educational Data System (CBEDS) Web site (www.cde.ca.gov/ds/sd/cb/). CBEDS data are reported by districts in the aggregate (as opposed to individual student data). Graduates received a diploma by meeting all high school graduation requirements. They include students who graduated in the summer and do not include students with high school equivalencies (i.e., GED or CHSPE) or special education students who completed an individualized education program (IEP). “a-g” completers are graduates who completed all the high school courses required for UC or CSU admission and earned a grade of ‘C’ or better in each of the required courses.

Section II
California Public College/University Enrollment: Statewide

This section provides statewide UC, CSU, and California Community College (CCC) enrollment data for students from Hiram W. Johnson High School. Enrollment data are presented for the fall immediately following each school year for which data are presented in Table 1 (e.g., fall 2004 immediately follows the 2003-04 school year). Enrollment data are for full-time, first-time freshmen, 19 years old and younger, taking a regular (as opposed to non-credit, extension, or unknown) program. CPEC collects these data for individual students from the UC President's Office, the CSU Chancellor's Office, and the CCC Chancellor's Office. Each of those offices collect the data from their campuses.

Table 2 shows combined enrollment in any UC, CSU, and CCC campus statewide. For each year and group, the table provides the number of enrollees and the approximate percentage of graduates (from Table 1) those enrollees represent. For example, in the fall of 2004 there were 74 Asian/Pacific Islanders enrolled as full-time, first-time freshmen in any UC, CSU, or CCC campus statewide, and they represent approximately 46% of the 2003-04 Asian/Pacific Islander graduates. (The percentage can be greater than 100 because high school graduation is not a requirement for admission to a community college.)

NOTES. The percentage of graduates is approximate and can be greater than 100 because, due to the nature of the data, enrollees are not a perfect subset of the graduates (i.e., some enrollees are not graduates, and some graduates who enroll are not included). See the cover letter for more information. The numbers of graduates used as the denominators to compute the percentages are from Table 1. The sum of the female and male enrollees may be less than the total of enrollees because gender may be reported as "unknown" for some enrollees. Percentages are not reported for the "Other/Unknown" group because (a) it is not clear who is in this group and (b) because of the nature and sources of the data, there are often more enrollees (in this table) than graduates (in Table 1) reported for this group, inflating the percentage. For these reasons, the percentages for the "Other/Unknown" group are not useful data.

Tables 3, 4, and 5 show separate enrollment in UC, CSU, and CCC statewide. For each year and group, the tables provide the total number of enrollees in UC, CSU, and CCC (from Table 2), and the number and percentage of those enrollees in the specific segment. For example, Table 3 shows that in the fall of 2004 there were 74 Asian/Pacific Islanders from Hiram W. Johnson High School enrolled as full-time, first-time freshmen in any UC, CSU, or CCC campus statewide, of whom 4 (5.4%) were enrolled in UC, 22 (29.7%) were enrolled in CSU, and 48 (64.9%) were enrolled in a CCC.

Section III
California Public College/University Enrollment: Local Institutions

This section provides local UC, CSU, and CCC enrollment data for students from Hiram W. Johnson High School. As in Section II, enrollment data are presented for the fall immediately following each school year for which data are presented in Section I (e.g., fall 2004 immediately follows the 2003-04 school year), and enrollment data are for full-time, first-time freshmen, 19 years old and younger, taking a regular (as opposed to non-credit, extension, or unknown) program. CPEC collects these data for individual students from the UC President's Office, the CSU Chancellor's Office, and the CCC Chancellor's Office. Each of those offices collect the data from their campuses.

Table 6 shows combined enrollment in local colleges and universities, specifically UC Davis, CSU Sacramento, and any campus of the Los Rios Community College District (LRCCD). For each year and group, the table provides the number of enrollees at those campuses, and the corresponding percentage of all UC, CSU, and CCC enrollees statewide (from Table 2). For example, in the fall of 2004 there were 72 Asian/Pacific Islanders enrolled in UC Davis, CSU Sacramento, or any LRCCD campus. This represents 97.3 percent of all fall 2004 Asian/Pacific Islander enrollees.

Tables 7, 8, and 9 show separate enrollment at UC Davis (UCD), CSU Sacramento (CSUS), or a LRCCD campus. For each year and group, the tables provide the total number of enrollees at UCD, CSUS, or a LRCCD campus (from Table 6), and the number and percentage of those enrollees at the specific campus. For example, Table 7 shows that in the fall of 2004 there were 72 Asian/Pacific Islanders from Hiram W. Johnson High School enrolled at UCD, CSUS, or a LRCCD campus, of whom 3 (4.2%) were enrolled at UCD, 21 (29.2%) were enrolled at CSUS, and 48 (66.7%) were enrolled at a LRCCD campus.

Tables 10, 11, and 12 show separate enrollment at the four LRCCD campuses: American River College (ARC), Cosumnes River College (CRC), Folsom Lake College (FLC), and Sacramento City College (SCC). For each year and group, the tables provide the total number of enrollees at the four LRCCD campuses (from Tables 7, 8, or 9), and the number and percentage of those enrollees at each campus. For example, Table 10 shows that in the fall of 2004 there were 48 Asian/Pacific Islanders from Hiram W. Johnson High School enrolled at a LRCCD campus, of whom 1 (2.1%) was enrolled at ARC, 10 (20.8%) were enrolled at CRC, 0 (0%) were enrolled at FLC, and 37 (77.1%) were enrolled at SSC.
