Assembly Bill 607 (Chapter 704, Statutes of 2006)

- Instructional Materials Reviews: 65 schools
- Facilities Reviews: 69 schools
 - 4 schools assigned a School Assistance and Intervention Team (SAIT); therefore, only required facilities reviews
- Changes from 2007-2008 Reviews
 - QEIA schools that are not decile 1-3 must be visited

Good News!

- Across the state 30% of schools fall into Decile 1-3, in Sacramento 30.7% of the schools are in these lowest deciles of student achievement
- Only 7 of the Sacramento County's 13 school districts have any schools in the bottom one-third (Deciles 1-3) of schools statewide
- Grant High School was selected for an observation visit by Brooks Allen of American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU). SCOE received kudos for an excellent visit. In fact, Mr. Allen stated that "the questioning of students in the classroom and attention to detail could serve as a model for *Williams* inspectors and team leaders statewide."

- In addition to SCOE staff's regular responsibilities, over 1,100 staff hours were spent organizing and conducting Williams reviews and reports
- Over 1,083 classrooms reviewed for instructional materials
- Over 1,500 areas within school sites reviewed for condition of the facilities
- Curriculum knowledge vital to assisting schools

Results: Sufficiency of Instructional Materials

- 3 of 65 schools found to have insufficient instructional materials
- All insufficiencies have been corrected

Results: Condition of School Facilities

- No schools with emergency or urgent threats to health and safety
- 55 of 69 schools found to be in exemplary condition
- 13 of 69 schools found to be in good condition
- 1 school found to be in fair condition

Results: Teacher Vacancies and Misassignments

- SCOE Human Resources staff worked with districts to collect data on teacher vacancies
- “Vacancy” definition:
 - A position to which single-designated certificated employee has not been assigned within the first 20 school days of the year or semester
- 4 of 7 reviewed districts reported no vacancies
 - Remaining 3 districts had a total of 9.5 positions vacant; representing 16.5 classes without assigned teachers at the beginning of the school year

Results: Teacher Vacancies and Misassignments (cont.)

- Misassignments data collected over course of year is reported to the Commission on Teacher Credentialing on July 1 of each year
- 12 uncorrected teacher misassignments reported in 2007-08 for Decile 1-3 schools

Results: Summary of Uniform Complaints (UCP)

- First quarter of 2007-08 school year
 - UCP complaints remain low and are being resolved in an expeditious manner
- Only three districts reported filed complaints
 - 1 instructional materials complaint
 - 3 condition of facilities complaints
 - 1 teacher complaint
- One of the facilities complaints has not been resolved

Accuracy of School Accountability Report Card (SARC)

- Beginning with the 2008-2009 school year SARCs must be published by February 1st and reviewed for accuracy in areas of instructional materials sufficiency and condition of school facilities, including whether they are in good repair.

Work Continues

- Currently debriefing with SCOE and district staff to determine how to improve future reviews
- Working with John Fleischman and his staff to develop a web-based system to improve information collection to conduct reviews in 2008-2009
- Preparing for limited reviews in February/March 2009 to follow-up on instructional materials use, and spot check sufficiency of instructional materials during second half of school year

- Quality Education Investment Act (QEIA) Annual Monitoring

Valenzuela

AB 347 (Nava, Chapter 526, Statutes of 2007)

- Requires school districts, charter schools, and county superintendents that participate in a specified categorical funding program – the intensive instruction and services program – to offer services to students who did not pass the CAHSEE by the end of grade 12
- Establishes oversight and monitoring responsibilities for county superintendents

Key Elements of AB 347


Eligibility for services:

- Students who did not pass the CAHSEE by the end of grade 12, beginning with Class of 2006
- Students are entitled to services for two consecutive academic years following grade 12

Basis for Funding Allocation:

- Students in grade 12 that have not passed the CAHSEE
- Students in grade 11 that have not passed the CAHSEE, if funds are not exhausted

Key Elements of AB 347 (cont.)

Notification requirements:

- Notify students of eligibility for services and the right to file a complaint regarding those services by sending a letter to last known address
- Notify students before the end of the school term in sufficient time to register for services
- Notify students each term for two academic years after grade 12
- Post notice of eligibility for services at district office, school sites, and on district Internet website

Key Elements of AB 347 (cont.)

- A paper review was conducted for the first time in spring 2008
- All required districts complied
- Fall visitations will occur with a sample of tutoring programs throughout the county

QEIA Monitoring Update

- QEIA reviews must occur for the first time after one full year of funding, which will be Summer 2009
- Documenting procedures are being developed
