2008-09 Textbook Insufficiency Report

Our reviewers determined the following insufficiencies:

Insufficient number of instructional materials as evidenced by the following deficiencies:

The Williams review team understands that the English/language arts instructional materials have been ordered as of September 10, 2008 and that the science instructional materials have been ordered as of August 25, 2008. Moreover, the team understands that the instructional materials have not been received and are on backorder.

The *Education Code*¹ provides school districts the opportunity to remedy deficiencies found during the Williams review. The county superintendent is responsible to ensure that any deficiency is remedied within the first eight weeks of the school term.² If, however, the plan to remedy the insufficiency is not implemented, the county superintendent is required to request that the Superintendent of Public Instruction purchase the needed textbooks for the school with the purchase treated as a loan to the district.

¹*Education Code* 1240(i) requires the county superintendent of schools to enforce the use of state textbooks regularly adopted by the proper authority and defines sufficient textbooks as each pupil, including English learners, has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home.

²*Education Code* Section 1240(i)(4)(C) requires remediation of a deficiency no later than the second month of the school term.
