



Dual Enrollment

Dual enrollment allows qualified high school students to enroll in college classes while simultaneously earning high school and college credits.

Courses/Instructors

Courses are taught by college faculty and/or high school teachers who have been approved by the community college to teach dual enrollment courses. They can be at the high school, community college or online. Classes offered on high school campuses are closed to the general public.

College Credit

Credit for a college course is awarded through a college transcript after successful completion of the course. If the college course meets a high school graduation requirement, the high school may award high school credit upon successful completion of the course.

Benefits

- Save money and time to earn a college degree.
- Eliminate duplication of coursework between high school and college.
- Explore career fields before starting college.

Cost

There is no cost for tuition if the student is enrolled under a College and Career Access Pathway (CCAP) Partnership Agreement and textbooks are provided by the high school.

Eligibility

- Dual enrollment students must be attending a participating College and Career Access Pathway (CCAP) high school.
- Eligibility may vary based on specific course requirements.
