Educational Rights

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Act, Title IX, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) 2015, provides educational rights for individuals who lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence. It applies to children and youth who are:

- Sharing the housing of others due to loss of housing or economic hardship
- Living in a motel, trailer park, or campground due to lack of alternative options
- Staying in a car, substandard housing, or place not designated for sleeping
- Staying in a housing shelter
- Migratory children if in the previously described situations

Children have the right to:

- Immediately enroll in school with or without the proper documentation or immunization record
 - Remain in the school of origin (a school the child attended within the past 15 months) for the duration of homelessness
 - Transportation to the school of origin
 - Enroll without a permanent address or proof of residency
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Local Educational Agency Liaison

School Districts are required to have a designated liaison to ensure that children experiencing homelessness receive education services. Contact the homeless liaison for educational resources and services. (Refer to the Homeless Liaison Directory):

- Assistance with school enrollment, attendance, and academic success
 - Coordination between schools and shelters or housing agencies
 - Facilitation with transfer of school records
 - Access to special education and after school programs
 - Referrals to community resources that assist with food, shelter, and clothing
 - Access to school nutrition programs
 - Transportation resources to enable students to attend school
 - School supplies and resources for students
 - Parent consultation including discussion of educational rights and responsibilities
 - Community awareness campaigns
