Types of Substitutes

Substitute teachers for alternative education programs for at-risk youth in:

- Community schools
- Court school (youth detention facility)
- CARE Program Classrooms

Substitute teachers and paraprofessional educators for special education programs in:

- · Classrooms for students with emotional disabilities
- Classrooms for students with severe disabilities

Paraprofessional educators work under the supervision of a certificated or licensed staff member to support and assist in providing instructional and other direct services to children, youth, and families.

Requirements

Substitute teacher candidates must have a bachelor's degree and meet basic skills-most often met through passing the California Basic Skills Test (CBEST)

Para-educator candidates must have a high school diploma and pass an Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) multiple-choice test administered by SCOE.
