#### BACKGROUND:

The governing board of the Elk Grove Unified School District (EGUSD) has adopted and submitted a proposal to change the method of electing EGUSD governing board members. (Ed. Code, § 5019(a), (c).) Currently, the seven EGUSD board members are elected under a "hybrid at-large" system, where one member residing within each of the seven currently existing trustee areas is elected by the registered voters of the entire school district. EGUSD proposes, effective for the November 2022 election, to change its election method so one board member residing within each trustee area will be elected by the registered voters residing in that trustee area ("by-trustee area" elections).

EGUSD board members are elected in even-numbered years and serve staggered, fouryear terms. The next election for three EGUSD board members is scheduled for November 2022, and the election for the remaining four board members is scheduled for November 2024. EGUSD proposes to maintain the same sequence of elections.

By law, the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization (County Committee) must call and conduct a hearing on EGUSD's proposal and, at the conclusion of its hearing, approve or disapprove EGUSD's proposal. (Ed. Code, § 5019(c)(2).)

#### PUBLIC HEARING PROCESS:

EGUSD's proposal and public website and other publicly available information indicate the following history, public hearings, outreach, and other events related to EGUSD's proposed change of election method:

- 1959 EGUSD was created through a unification process. Seven trustee areas were established to ensure representation of the prior merged school districts.
- 2011 EGUSD last updated its trustee areas map to equalize population within its seven trustee areas.

- December 17, 2019 EGUSD adopted Resolution No. 32, 2019-20 to initiate a transition to a by-trustee area election system commencing with the November 2022 governing board election. At that time, EGUSD intended to wait until the release of the 2020 census data, then scheduled for March 2021, to begin the transition process.
- May 4, 2021 Due to COVID-19 pandemic-related delays in releasing the 2020 census data, the potential for further delay, the tight timelines to complete the process for 2022 elections, and EGUSD's aspiration for a robust public input process, EGUSD decided to immediately move forward to change to by-trustee area elections. Therefore, EGUSD adopted Resolution No. 67, 2020-21, reaffirming its intent to transition to "by-trustee area" elections using 2010 census data and to make any necessary adjustments to its trustee areas to ensure appropriate population balance after the 2020 census data is released.
- May 4, 2021 and May 18, 2021 EGUSD held public hearings to consider community input and comment regarding potential trustee area boundaries.
- May 18, 2021 EGUSD adopted Resolution No. 72, 2020-2021 authorizing the district to seek a waiver from the State Board of Education regarding electorate approval of the proposed change from at-large to by-trustee area elections.
- June 8, 2021 EGUSD published three (3) potential trustee area maps.
- June 15, 2021 and July 20, 2021 EGUSD held public hearings to gather public input on the proposed election method change, trustee-area maps, and sequence of elections.
- December 13-17, 2019 and April 30-August 19, 2021 EGUSD conducted extensive community outreach and provided public notice of EGUSD's public hearings, proposed election method change, potential maps, and process through multiple communications, public agenda notifications, newspaper and social media (Twitter, Instagram, Facebook) postings, EGUSD website postings, emails to all district staff, parents/guardians, and community members in EGUSD's system, consultations with EGUSD's seven labor organizations, and consultation with the District Advisory Committee and English Language Advisory Committee.
- August 10, 2021 EGUSD held public hearing and adopted Resolution No. 10, 2021-22 proposing to transition to "by-trustee area" elections using the currently existing EGUSD trustee area boundaries map and sequence of elections.
- September 9-10, 2021 State Board of Education to hear EGUSD's request to waive Education Code requirement that proposed election method changes be submitted to school district voters for approval or denial.
- September 9, 2021 County Committee to hear and consider EGUSD's proposal to change to "by-trustee area" elections and establish the sequence of elections.

#### COUNTY COMMITTEE ROLE:

The County Committee must call and conduct a hearing and, at its conclusion, either approve or disapprove EGUSD's proposal. (Ed. Code, § 5019(c)(2).)

EGUSD Resolution No. 10, 2021-22 (Attachment 1) requests County Committee approval of its proposal to:

- (1) Transition to by-trustee area elections, implementing EGUSD's existing seven trustee area boundaries map.
- (2) Maintain the current sequence of elections for EGUSD's seven trustee areas as follows:
  - a. Trustee Areas 2, 4, and 5 scheduled for election in 2022; and
  - b. Trustee Areas 1, 3, 6, and 7 scheduled for election in 2024.

The relevant statutes provide no guidelines or standards by which the County Committee must review a school district's proposal. Therefore, the County Committee has discretion to consider EGUSD's proposal in light of the local area concerned. Absent specific standards, government entities often give deference to the decisions of other governmental entities with more localized knowledge of the issue at hand, unless the local decision was arbitrary, capricious, or entirely lacking in evidentiary support. Thus, if the record reflects rational reasons for EGUSD's decision, the reasons are supported by evidence, and the decision is not in violation of the law, the County Committee may properly approve EGUSD's proposal.

In the event that the County Committee approves EGUSD's proposal after the public hearing, a proposed resolution (County Committee Resolution No. CC-21-02) is included for the County Committee's consideration. If the County Committee denies EGUSD's proposal, a resolution is not needed.

#### Approval by County Committee

If the County Committee approves EGUSD's proposal to change to "by-trustee area" elections, and the State Board of Education waives the requirement that EGUSD voters approve or deny the proposed change of election method,<sup>1</sup> EGUSD will change to by-trustee area elections beginning with the next EGUSD governing board election on November 8, 2022. Once 2020 census data is available, EGUSD will be required to review and potentially update its trustee areas map based on the new census data by March 1, 2022. (Ed. Code, § 5019.5.)

#### Denial by County Committee

If the County Committee denies EGUSD's current proposal, EGUSD could conduct further public hearing(s) to consider and adopt an alternative plan and submit a revised proposal or take no further action and maintain the status quo.

If the County Committee denies EGUSD's proposal to change to by-trustee area elections and/or does not act on a new proposal submitted under Education Code section 5019 before the Sacramento County Registrar's deadline (February 2, 2022), EGUSD's election method will remain as it is now for the November 2022 election, with governing board members who reside in each of the seven trustee areas elected by the registered voters of the entire school district ("hybrid at-large elections").

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S RECOMMENDATION:

The Sacramento County Superintendent of Schools recommends that the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization hold a public hearing and approve or deny EGUSD's proposal.

#### NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

A public hearing will be held by the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization (County Committee) to receive public comment and input from the community regarding the Elk Grove Unified School District's (EGUSD) proposal to change its method of electing governing board members. Currently, seven EGUSD board members are elected under a "hybrid at-large" system, where one board member residing within each of the seven currently existing trustee areas is elected by the registered voters of the entire school district. EGUSD proposes to change its election method so that one governing board member residing in each trustee area will be elected by the registered voters residing in that trustee area ("by-trustee area elections"). At the conclusion of the public hearing, the County Committee may take action to approve or disapprove EGUSD's proposal to change election methods, including its proposed trustee area boundaries map and sequence of elections.

The public hearing is scheduled for Thursday, September 9, 2021 at 6:30 p.m.

In compliance with current California Executive Order N-08-21 allowing local legislative bodies to satisfy transparency requirements by holding meetings via teleconference, the County Committee will conduct this hearing via Zoom video and/or teleconference. #### Re: Proposal to County Committee on School District Organization

Dear Ms. Stinson:

I am writing today on behalf of the Elk Grove Unified School District to respectfully submit the District Board of Education's proposal to adopt by-trustee area elections for approval by the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization ("County Committee").

The Board is currently elected under a hybrid "at-large" election system, where trustees reside in designated trustee areas, and are elected by voters of the entire District. Upon consideration of the California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA"), on December 17, 2019, the Board adopted Resolution No. 32, 2019-20, Resolution to Initiate a Transition to a By-Trustee Area Election System Commencing with the 2022 Governing Board Election.

As provided in Resolution No. 32, 2019-20, the Board intended to wait until the release of the 2020 Census data, scheduled for March 2021, and then immediately begin the transition process. Due to COVID-19 pandemic-related delays in releasing the 2020 Census data, and the tight timelines to complete the process in time for the 2022 elections, the District opted to move forward immediately using 2010 census data to change to by-trustee area elections with the understanding that the final maps to be used in the 2022 election will rely upon the 2020 census data.

On May 4, 2021, the Board adopted Resolution No. 67, 2020-21 reaffirming its intent to transition to by-trustee area Board elections using 2010 Census data and making applicable modifications to the trustee areas when the 2020 Census data is released.

On August 10, 2021, after five public hearings on the proposed transition, the Board adopted Resolution No. 10, 2021-22, initiating the following proposal to the County Committee for approval:

1. The Elk Grove Unified School District Board of Education will transition to by-trustee area elections, implementing the trustee area boundaries identified in the map designated "Existing Trustee Area Map."

- 2. The Elk Grove Unified School District Board of Education elections will be sequenced according to the following schedule:
  - a. Trustee areas 2, 4, and 5 scheduled for election in 2022; and
  - b. Trustee areas 1, 3, 6, and 7 scheduled for election in 2024.

As indicated in the Resolution, in initiating this proposal, the Board took all necessary steps to comply with the appropriate procedures and policies of law and conducted extensive public outreach.

Education Code sections 5019 and 5030 authorize the County Committee to approve the Board's

proposed change from at-large to by-trustee area elections. When such a proposal is made, the

County Committee shall call and conduct at least one public hearing within the district making

the proposal on the matter, and at the conclusion of the hearing, shall approve or disapprove the

proposal. (Ed. Code, § 5019, subd. (c)(2).)

In preparation for the County Committee meeting currently scheduled for September 9, 2021, I would like to present the District's proposal to adopt by-trustee area elections. As part of this proposal, please find the following documents enclosed with this letter:

- Resolution No. 10, 2021-22, *Resolution Initiating a Proposal to the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization for the Adoption of By-Trustee Area Elections;*
- The trustee area map selected by the Board at the August 10, 2021, Board Meeting ("Existing Trustee Area Map");
- The election sequencing schedule selected by the Board at the August 10, 2021 Board Meeting;
- Resolution No. 72, 2020-21, *Resolution Authorizing the District to Seek a Waiver from the State Board of Education Regarding Electorate Approval of the Proposed Change from At-Large to By-Trustee Area Elections; and*
- A packet detailing the district's community outreach efforts during the hearing process.

Please let me know if you or the County Committee needs any additional information, or if you would like to set up a time to discuss the District's proposal further. We look forward to working with you as the District completes this process.

#### RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE ELK GROVE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT Resolution No. 10, 2021-22

#### Resolution Initiating a Proposal to the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization for the Adoption of By-Trustee Area Elections

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees ("Board") of the Elk Grove Unified School District ("District") are currently elected using a hybrid version of an "at-large" election system (i.e., election system in which registered voters of the entire jurisdiction elect candidates to the Board but board members reside in defined trustee areas);

**WHEREAS**, on December 17, 2019, the Board adopted Resolution No. 32, 2019-20, a Resolution to Initiate a Transition to a By-Trustee Area Election System commencing with the 2022 Governing Board election. (See Exhibit A attached to this Resolution). At that time, the Board intended to wait until the release of the 2020 federal census data, scheduled for March 2021, to develop its new trustee area boundary lines;

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2021, the Board adopted Resolution 67, 2020-21 (See Exhibit B attached to this Resolution), reaffirming its intent to transition to "by-trustee-area" elections, where each trustee must reside within the designated trustee-area boundary and is elected only by the voters in that trustee-area. In light of COVID-19 pandemic-related delays to the release of the 2020 census data, the Board determined it was in the best interests of the District to avoid further delay and move forward with the transition to by-trustee area elections using 2010 Census data;

WHEREAS, National Demographics Corporation ("Demographer") was retained to prepare several by-trustee-area election system map options for the Board and public's consideration using 2010 census data;

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Elections Code and other applicable provisions of law, the Board held public hearings on May 4, 2021, and May 18, 2021, to consider community input and comment regarding potential trustee-area boundaries;

WHEREAS, the Board published three (3) trustee-area maps on June 8, 2021, and held public hearings on June 15, 2021 and July 20, 2021, to gather public input on the proposed trustee-area maps and sequence of elections;

**WHEREAS**, Education Code sections 5019, 5030 and other applicable provisions of law, authorize the Sacramento County Committee on School Reorganization ("County Committee"), upon application from a school district's governing board, to change the method of election in a school district under its jurisdiction;

*WHEREAS*, Education Code section 5020 requires the County Committee's resolution of approval to be submitted to the electorate for its approval;

**WHEREAS**, Education Code sections 33050-33053 authorize the State Board of Education to waive this voter approval requirement, which could reduce the costs associated with the proposed change to trustee-area elections; and

*WHEREAS*, on May 18, 2021, the Board adopted Resolution No. 72, 2020-21 (See Exhibit C attached to this Resolution), authorizing the Superintendent to seek a waiver of the Education Code's election requirement from the State Board of Education; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has completed all requirement imposed by law for the selection of a preferred trustee area map and election sequencing and desires to transition to by-trustee area elections;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, the Board of Trustees of the Elk Grove Unified School District hereby resolves as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are correct and true.
- 2. The Board hereby approves and recommends that the County Committee approve the District's transition to by-trustee area elections and the adoption of the trustee-area map set forth in Exhibit D, which has been referenced by the District as the Existing Trustee Area Map.
- 3. The Board hereby approves and recommends that the County Committee approve the election sequencing of each trustee area as set forth in Exhibit D.
- 4. The District Superintendent or designee is hereby authorized and directed to send a copy of this Resolution to the County Committee, and to work with the County Committee and the County Election's Office to conduct all legally required hearings and other acts necessary so that by-trustee area elections can be implemented in the election cycles scheduled in 2022 and 2024.

#### RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE ELK GROVE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT Resolution No. 32, 2019-20

#### Resolution to Initiate a Transition to a By-Trustee Area Election System Commencing with the 2022 Governing Board Election

WHEREAS, California Education Code sections 5019 and 5030 authorize the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization ("County Committee"), upon application of a school district's Governing Board, to change the method of election of Governing Board members in a school district under its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA") disfavors the use of an "atlarge" election system for governing board members of a school district if the "at-large" election system may impair the ability of a protected class to elect candidates of its choice or its ability to influence the outcome of an election;

WHEREAS, board members of the Elk Grove Unified School District ("District") are currently elected using a hybrid version of an "at-large" election system (i.e., election system in which registered voters of the entire jurisdiction elect candidates to the Governing Board but board members reside in defined trustee areas);

WHEREAS, the Board desires to promote meaningful voter involvement in the election of board members and increase the ability of candidates to seek elected office;

WHEREAS, the boundaries for trustee areas in a by-trustee area election system are established based on population counts and demographics from the most recent United States' census;

WHEREAS, the United States' census count occurs every ten (10) years with the last census count occurring in 2010 ("2010 Census") and the next census count is scheduled to take place during 2020 ("2020 Census"), with the results to be made available to state and local agencies in early 2021;

WHEREAS, if the District transitioned to by-trustee area elections for the November, 2020, election, trustee areas would be established based on the 2010 Census, which (1) may not fairly and accurately reflect the current voter population distribution and demographics of the District, and (2) would require the District to incur additional, duplicative costs to adjust the trustee areas based on the 2020 Census as required by Education Code Section 5019.5;

WHEREAS, the adoption of "by-trustee area" elections will not affect the terms of any board members serving or elected during this transition, each of whom will serve out his or her full term; and

WHEREAS, the Board, cognizant of its need to be fiscally responsible, desires to implement this change in the manner of electing board members in a cost effective and efficient manner but with all deliberate speed following release of the 2020 census data.

#### VI.A.12.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board hereby resolves, orders and determines as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct;
- 2. Trustee area boundary lines shall be developed based on the 2020 federal decennial census data following its release in 2021 to provide for "by-trustee areas" elections to be implemented in the 2022 and 2024 election cycles;
- 3. Pursuant to Education Code sections 5019, 5030 and other applicable provisions of law, the Board directs District staff to transmit this resolution to the County Committee so that the County Committee will be on notice of the District's intent, in 2021, to adopt a change in the method of electing members of the Board from "at-large" elections to "by-trustee area" elections commencing with the 2022 Board elections;
- 4. Before submitting a final proposal to the County Committee for trustee area maps using the 2020 federal census data, multiple public hearings in accordance with Elections Code section 10010 and other applicable laws shall be scheduled to obtain public input on the draft maps and proposals;

- 6. If approved by the County Committee, Education Code section 5020 requires the County Committee's resolution of approval to be submitted to the electorate for its approval unless the District seeks and obtains a waiver of this requirement from the State Board of Education pursuant to Education Code sections 33050-33053. Accordingly, the Board hereby directs district staff to seek a waiver of this election requirement in a timely manner as allowed by law;
- 7. The Superintendent, or designee, is hereby directed to contract with a reputable demographer as soon as possible following adoption of this resolution to ensure that the District is able to implement this change in election systems with all deliberate speed following release of the 2020 census data;
- 8. The Superintendent, or designee, is hereby directed to prepare additional Board resolutions and documents, as needed, to meet all applicable legal requirements in a timely manner acting with all deliberate speed;
- 9. The Superintendent, or designee, shall consult with legal counsel to take all steps necessary to implement and give effect to this resolution; and
- 10. The foregoing resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

#### RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE ELK GROVE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT Resolution No. 67, 2020-21

#### Resolution to Re-Initiate a Transition to a By-Trustee Area Election System Commencing with the 2022 Governing Board Election

WHEREAS, California Education Code sections 5019 and 5030 authorize Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization ("County Committee"), upon application of a school district's Governing Board, to change the method of election of Governing Board members in a school district under its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA") disfavors the use of an "atlarge" election system for governing board members of a school district if the "at-large" election system may impair the ability of a protected class to elect candidates of its choice or its ability to influence the outcome of an election;

WHEREAS, board members of the Elk Grove Unified School District ("District") are currently elected using a hybrid version of an "at-large" election system (i.e., election system in which registered voters of the entire jurisdiction elect candidates to the Governing Board but board members reside in defined trustee areas);

WHEREAS, the Board desires to promote meaningful voter involvement in the election of Board members and increase the ability of candidates to seek elected office;

WHEREAS, the boundaries for mustee areas in a by-trustee area election system are established based on population counts and demographics from the most recent United States' census;

WHEREAS, on December 17, 2019, the Board adopted Resolution No. 32, 2019-20, a Resolution to Initiate a Transition to a By-Trustee Area Election System Commencing with the 2022 Governing Board Election;

WHEREAS, the United States' census count occurs every ten (10) years with the last census count occurring in 2020 ("2020 Census");

WHEREAS, as provided in Resolution No. 32, 2019-20, the Board intended to wait until the release of the 2020 federal decennial census data, scheduled for March 2021, to develop its new trustee area boundary lines;

WHEREAS, due to COVID-19 pandemic-related delays, the 2020 Census data is not expected to be made available to state and local agencies until September 30, 2021 or later, which is a substantial delay from the original due date of March 31, 2021;

WHEREAS, due to this significant delay, the potential for further delay, and the tight timelines to complete the process in time for the 2022 elections, the Board has concerns about continuing to delay the process until the 2020 Census data is released;

#### VI.A.15.

WHEREAS, the Board aspires to promote a robust public input process, and believes that it is now in the best interest of the District not to wait until the release of the 2020 Census data, but to move forward immediately to transition by-trustee area elections using the 2010 Census data pursuant to the process provided in the Elections Code and Education Code;

WHEREAS, the Board will hold a minimum of two public hearings prior to developing proposed trustee-area boundary maps;

WHEREAS, the District will hold a minimum of two additional public hearings to seek public input on the proposed trustee area maps developed with assistance from a demographer;

WHEREAS, the District will hold an additional public hearing before adopting a trusteearea map and submitting it to the County Committee for consideration;

WHEREAS, Education Code sections 5019 and 5030 authorize the County Committee, upon application of the District Board, to change the method of election of the Board from atlarge to by-trustee area;

WHEREAS, if the County Committee approves this request to change the method of electing trustees, Education Code section 5020 requires the County Committee's resolution of approval to be submitted to the electorate for its approval;

WHEREAS, in the alternative, the District may seek a waiver of this voter approval requirement from the State Board of Education;

WHEREAS, once the transition process is complete, and the 2020 Census data is released, the District will then review the new Census data as required by Education Code section 5019.5, and make any necessary adjustments to ensure appropriate population balance;

WHEREAS, the adoption of "by-trustee area" elections will not affect the terms of any board members serving or elected during this transition, each of whom will serve out his or her full term.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board hereby resolves, orders and determines as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct;
- 2. The District shall immediately commence the process of transitioning to bytrustee area elections, in full compliance with all appropriate procedures and policies provided in law, including but not limited to Education Code sections 5019, 5030, and 33050, et seq., and Elections Code sections 10010 and 14025, et seq.;
- 3. Once the transition process is completed, and the 2020 Census data is made available to the District, the Board directs staff to review the new Census data pursuant to Education Code sections 5019, 5030 and other applicable provisions of law, to determine whether adjustments to the adopted trustee area map are required.

#### Resolution Authorizing the District to Seek a Waiver from the State Board of Education Regarding Electorate Approval of the Proposed Change from At-Large to By-Trustee Board Elections

WHEREAS, board members of the Elk Grove Unified School District ("District") are currently elected using a hybrid version of an "at-large" election system in which registered voters of the entire jurisdiction elect candidates to the Governing Board, but board members reside in defined trustee areas;

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2021, the Board adopted Resolution No. 67, 2020-21, redeclaring its intent to transition to a by-trustee area election system, where each trustee must reside within a designated trustee area boundary, and is elected only by the voters in that trustee area;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code section 10010(a)(1), the Board held two public hearings (May 4, 2021 and May 18, 2021) to gather public input regarding potential trustee area boundaries;

WHEREAS, the District, with assistance from a demographer, will hold a minimum of two additional public hearings to seek public input on the proposed trustee area maps and on the proposed sequence of elections;

WHEREAS, the District will hold an additional public hearing before adopting a trusteearea map and submitting it to the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization ("County Committee") for consideration;

WHEREAS, Education Code sections 5019 and 5030 authorize the County Committee, upon application of the District Board, to change the method of election of the Board from atlarge to by-trustee area;

WHEREAS, if the County Committee approves this request to change the method of electing Board members, Education Code section 5020 requires the County Committee's resolution of approval to be submitted to the electorate for its approval;

WHEREAS, the District would have to incur a monetary cost to hold an election to approve the change in voting methods;

WHEREAS, Education Code sections 33050-33053 authorize the State Board of Education to waive this voter approval requirement, which could eliminate this election cost, and expedite the timeline for implementation of the by-trustee area elections;

WHEREAS, in light of the above, the Board wishes to request that the State Board of Education waive the election requirement set forth in the Education Code;

#### VI.A.18.

WHEREAS, on May 18, 2021, the Board held a public hearing on the proposed waiver application to solicit input from the public and the District's stakeholders;

WHEREAS, the District properly posted a timely notice of the public hearing in a newspaper of general circulation, and at various sites within the District; and

- 3. The District Superintendent/designee is hereby authorized and directed to take any other actions necessary to effectuate the purposes of this resolution.







# California's Voting Options and Board Election History

## California's Voting Options

- At-Large: All voters elect all trustees.
- Hybrid System: Board members live in trustee areas but are elected at-large. ("From District Voting")
  - Elk Grove's current method of election
- By-Trustee Areas: Board members live in trustee areas and are elected only by voters in those trustee areas. ("By-District or District-Based Voting")





### **Current Governing Board Composition**

- Currently seven-member Board elected using the "hybrid model."
- Elk Grove board members represent seven geographic areas and are elected at large.

#### District's Board Election History

- 1959: Elk Grove Unified School District was created through a unification process.
- Seven trustee areas established to ensure representation of prior merged school districts.





#### District's Board Election History (Cont.)

- 2011: Trustee areas last updated for population balance.
- 2019: Board passes a Resolution to Initiate a Transition to a By-Trustee Area Election System Commencing with the 2022 Governing Board Election.





# California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA")

## California Voting Righs Act ("CVRA")


- Prohibits the use of "at-large" elections that impair the ability of a protected class to:
  - Elect candidates of its choice; or
  - To influence the outcome of an election.
- "Racially Polarized Voting"
- Proof of intent to discriminate not required.






### At-Large/Hybrid Elk Grove Model

- Trustees reside within an election district.
- All voters elect all trustees: Form of at-large voting.



# By-Trustee Area Elections: The Only Method of Election Guaranteed NOT to Violate the CVRA

- Trustees must reside within specific trustee areas.
- Only voters residing within the specified trustee area may vote for that particular trustee.



## **CVRA** Litigation

High cost of litigation to public agencies (attorneys' fees for both sides). Estimated fees and costs paid *to plaintiff's counsel*:

- City of Santa Monica (\$22 million court ordered)
- City of Santa Clara (Approximately \$3 million court ordered)
- West Contra Costa Unified School District (\$310,000 settlement)
- City of Modesto (\$3 million settlement)
- Tulare Regional Medical Center (\$500,000 settlement)
- Madera Unified School District (\$162,500 court ordered)
- ABC Unified School District (\$140,000 settlement)



### CVRA Litigation (Cont.): City of Santa Monica Case

- Trial Court ruled that City's elections violated the CVRA, awarding \$22 million in attorney's fees.
- The 2<sup>nd</sup> District Court of Appeal reversed, concluding that Latinos would constitute 30 percent of any particular trustee area, and "30 percent is not enough to win a majority and to elect someone to the City Council, even in a district system."
- California Supreme Court granted review, de-published the appellate court case, and the case is now pending.



# Transitioning to By-Trustee Area Elections

#### Step 1: Adopt Intent Resolution



 District board adopts intent resolution, specifying desire to adopt by-trustee area elections.



### Step 2: Hearing Procedures and Map Development

- "<u>Pre-Map" Hearings</u>: Two public hearings prior to preparing proposed by-trustee area maps.
- "<u>Map Consideration</u>" <u>Hearings</u>: Two public hearings to consider proposed by-trustee area maps.
- <u>Map Adoption Hearing</u>: Public hearing before adopting final bytrustee area map.





### Step 3: County Committee Review

- The County Committee on School District Organization has the authority to change the method of election in a school district under its jurisdiction.
- County Committee must hold at least one hearing in the District to consider the proposal.
- The County Committee shall vote to approve or deny the District's proposal to establish trustee-areas and adopt trustee-area elections.



### Step 4: Election or Waiver from State Board of Education

- If County Committee approves the proposal, an election is called seeking voter approval.
- This voter approval requirement can be waived by the State Board of Education, upon an application from the District. These waivers are typically sought and routinely granted.



# Timing of Transition Process

#### Delay in Release of 2020 Census Data

- Per Resolution No. 32, 2019-20, the Board intended to wait until the release of the 2020 Census data, scheduled for March 2021, and then immediately begin the transition process.
- However, due to COVID-19 pandemic-related delays, the 2020 Census data is not expected to be made available to state and local agencies until at least September 30, 2021.



#### Potential Impacts of Delay in Release of Census Data

- Tighter timelines to complete the process in time for 2022 Board elections;
- Less opportunity for robust public input process;
- Decreased demographer capacity and availability; and
- Extended timeframe of potential District liability under the CVRA.



#### Potential Options Moving Forward

Option 1: Complete the process now using 2010 Census data.

- Begin and complete the transition process now, using the 2010 Census data.
- Once the 2020 Census data is released, review the data using the District's newly adopted trustee area maps, and determine whether adjustments are necessary.

- Option 2: Await 2020 Census data.
- Hold pre-map hearings prior to the release of the 2020 Census data.
- Await the release of the 2020 Census data.
- Once the 2020 Census data is released, move forward quickly to complete the transition.

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#### **Proposed Actions**

- <u>If Option 1 (start process now using 2010 Census data)</u>:
  - Action required? Yes. Board should adopt the Resolution before the Board, and hold the first pre-map hearing tonight.
- If Option 2 (await release of 2020 Census data):
  - Action required? No. Board does not need to take any action tonight.



### **Redistricting Considerations**

- If Option 1 is selected, the District will become a by-trustee area voting district.
- By-trustee area districts must analyze the 2020 Census data to determine whether each trustee area has appropriate population balance.
- If appropriate balance is maintained, then no further action required.



### Redistricting Considerations (con't)

- If appropriate balance is <u>not</u> maintained, then the District must adjust its trustee areas.
- Only one public hearing/board meeting required.
- Additional hearings optional.
- County Committee approval <u>not</u> required.
- No election requirement so no SBE waiver needed.
- Complete process before March 1, 2022.

#### **Graduation Preparations**

Congratulations to the Class of 2021! Our schools are busy making final graduation ceremony preparations and if you have any graduation questions, please check with your student's school. We will be asking all graduation attendees to follow these social distancing guidelines:

For graduation attendee safety in a large crowd situation:

- Social distancing of 6 feet is required.
- Masks are required upon entering the stadium and throughout the ceremony.
- Graduates, household members and staff should not attend if feeling ill, have COVID-19 symptoms, or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19.
- Due to COVID-19 restrictions, please exit the stadium immediately after the ceremony.

### **By-Trustee Area Election System**

At the May 4th Board Meeting, the Board adopted Resolution No. 67, 2020-21. This resolution redeclared the Board's intent to transition to a by-trustee area election system starting with the 2022 election. A by-trustee area election system means that each trustee must reside within a designated trustee-area boundary and would be elected only by the voters in that trustee area. The Board held its first Pre-Map Hearing also at the May 4th meeting and on May 18, 2021, the Board will hold the second Pre-Map hearing as well as a hearing to seek a procedural waiver from the State Board of Education to avoid the costs associated with an election to affirm its proposed transition from the current hybrid "at-large" election system to a by-trustee election system.

If you are interested in this topic, we encourage your participation in the process during the <u>May</u> <u>18, 2021 Board Meeting</u>. It is anticipated that the Board will discuss this matter further during multiple Board Meetings through August 2021.

A school district seeking to transition to a by-trustee area election system must submit an application to the local County Committee on School District Reorganization ("County Committee") for approval. If the County Committee approves the school district's application, California Education Code section 5020 would require an election to approve the move to by-trustee area elections. To avoid the costs associated with an election and to ensure timely implementation, the Board is conrequirement, as well as certain other Education Code sections related to the election requirement. If the waiver is granted by the State Board of Education, no election to approve the change to by-trustee area elections will take place, and the County Committee's application will be final.

Pursuant to Education Code sections 5019 and 33050, the Board invites community input on the proposed waiver request. # California's Voting Options and Board Election History

# California's Voting Options

- At-Large: All voters elect all trustees.
- Hybrid System: Board members live in trustee areas but are elected at-large. ("From District Voting")
  - Elk Grove's current method of election
- By-Trustee Areas: Board members live in trustee areas and are elected only by voters in those trustee areas. ("By-District or District-Based Voting")





# California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA")

# California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA")


- Prohibits the use of "at-large" elections that impair the ability of a protected class to:
  - Elect candidates of its choice; or
  - To influence the outcome of an election.
- "Racially Polarized Voting"
- Proof of intent to discriminate not required.






# At-Large/Hybrid Elk Grove Model

- Trustees reside within an election district.
- All voters elect all trustees: Form of at-large voting.



# By-Trustee Area Elections: The Only Method of Election Guaranteed NOT to Violate the CVRA

- Trustees must reside within specific trustee areas.
- Only voters residing within the specified trustee area may vote for that particular trustee.



# **CVRA** Litigation

High cost of litigation to public agencies (attorneys' fees for both sides). Estimated fees and costs paid *to plaintiff's counsel*:

- City of Santa Monica (\$22 million court ordered)
- City of Santa Clara (Approximately \$3 million court ordered)
- West Contra Costa Unified School District (\$310,000 settlement)
- City of Modesto (\$3 million settlement)

# Step 1: Adopt Intent Resolution



 District board adopts intent resolution, specifying desire to adopt by-trustee area elections.



# Step 2: Hearing Procedures and Map Development

- "<u>Pre-Map</u>" <u>Hearings</u>: Two public hearings prior to preparing proposed by-trustee area maps.
- "<u>Map Consideration</u>" <u>Hearings</u>: Two public hearings to consider proposed by-trustee area maps.
- Map Adoption Hearing: Public hearing before adopting final by-

trustee area map.





# Step 3: County Committee Review

- The County Committee on School District Organization has the authority to change the method of election in a school district under its jurisdiction.
- County Committee must hold at least one hearing in the District to consider the proposal.
- The County Committee shall vote to approve or deny the District's proposal to establish trustee-areas and adopt trustee-area elections.



## Step 4: Election or Waiver from State Board of Education

• If County Committee approves the proposal, an election is called seeking voter approval.

• This voter approval requirement can be waived by the State Board of Education, upon an application from the District. These waivers are typically sought and routinely granted.

#### Elk Grove Unified School District to Hold Public Hearing on June 15, 2021 to Review Proposed Trustee Area Boundaries

On June 15, 2021 at or around 6 p.m., the Elk Grove Unified School District will hold a public hearing to receive community input on "draft" trustee area maps.

On May 4, 2021, the Board adopted Resolution No. 67, 2020-21, redeclaring its intent to transition from at-large to by-trustee area Board elections, where each Board member must reside within the designated trustee area boundary and is elected only by the voters in that trustee area. Pursuant to Elections Code section 10010(a)(1) the Board then held two public hearings, one on May 4, 2021 and one on May 18, 2021, to gather community input on the trustee area map creation process.

Following these hearings, the District published draft maps prepared by a demographer for the Board and the public's consideration. Those maps can be found by visiting the following website:

On June 15, 2021, the proposed trustee area maps will be presented to the Board. Following the presentation, the Board will hold the first of two statutorily required public hearings to receive community input on the proposed trustee area maps, pursuant to Elections Code section 10010(a)(2).

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order N-29-20, which temporarily suspends provisions of the Brown Act relating to public meetings. As such, Elk Grove Unified School District Board members will be conducting this open session board meeting via Zoom video/teleconferencing. 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### Process Update and Next Steps

- The Board has held three public hearings to date and tonight represents the fourth.
- All public hearings, maps, process and information has been made publicly available through multiple communications, newspaper postings, public agenda notifications and a dedicated webpage/link.
- Tonight's public hearing represents the final hearing on the consideration of maps prior to action.
- The August 10<sup>th</sup> Board meeting is intended for the Board to adopt a Trustee Area map, which will allow the Board to finalize the process to make the change to a By-Trustee Area election system.



### Process Update and Next Steps

- Population Estimates by Census Block and School Site information have been added to the interactive map system that is publicly available and provided to the Board.
- The District's State Board of Education (SBE) waiver has been submitted and accepted by SBE Staff and it has been placed on the September 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> SBE Agenda.
- District Staff and Legal Counsel have engaged the County Committee to discuss next steps and to schedule a County Committee meeting to consider the adopted map and election system modification.
- When the 2020 Census data is available the Board will again consider map revisions to ensure the Trustee Areas are balanced and consistent with the law.



### Demographic Summary

Each of the seven trustee areas must contain about 44,856 residents.

# Districting Process

Step	Description
December 17, 2019	Board adopted Resolution No. 32, 2019-20, a Resolution to Initiate a Transition to a By-Trustee Area Election System Commencing with the 2022 Governing Board Election. At that time, the Board intended to wait until the release of the 2020 federal census data, scheduled for March 2021, to develop its new trustee area boundary lines.
May 4, 2021	In light of COVID-19 pandemic-related delays to the release of census data, the Board determined it was in the best interests of the District to avoid further delay and move forward with the transition to by-trustee area elections using the 2010 Census data. The Board adopted Resolution No. 67, 2020-21, a second Resolution of Intent to change election system and held its first pre-draft-map hearing.
May 18, 2021	Second pre-draft-map hearing held. The Board gave direction regarding criteria for the development of communities of interest in the District. The Board also adopted Resolution No. 72, 2020-21, a Resolution authorizing the Superintendent to seek a waiver from the State Board of Education of the requirement to submit the change to the electorate.

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### Process Update and Next Steps

- The Board has held four public hearings to date and tonight represents the fifth.
- All public hearings, maps, process and information have been made publicly available through multiple communications, newspaper postings, public agenda notifications and a dedicated webpage/link.
- Tonight's meeting is intended for the Board to adopt a Trustee Area map, determine election sequencing, and finalize the process to make the change to a By-Trustee Area election system.



### Process Update and Next Steps

- The District's State Board of Education (SBE) waiver has been submitted and accepted by SBE Staff and it has been placed on the September 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> SBE Agenda.
- The County Committee has been asked to schedule a public hearing to consider the adopted map and election system modification.
- When the 2020 Census data is available the Board will again consider map revisions to ensure the Trustee Areas are population balanced and consistent with the law.



#### Demographic Summary

Each of the seven trustee areas must contain about 44,856 residents.

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

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

#### **RESOLUTION NO. CC-21-02**

#### Resolution Approving Elk Grove Unified School District Proposal Under Education Code Section 5019 to Change to "By-Trustee Area" Elections

**WHEREAS**, the governing board of the Elk Grove Unified School District (EGUSD) is composed of seven members, who are elected under a "hybrid at-large" system, where one member residing within each of the seven currently existing trustee areas is elected by the registered voters of the entire school district;

**WHEREAS**, Education Code section 5019 authorizes a school district governing board, by resolution, to change its method of electing governing board members;

**WHEREAS**, Education Code section 5030 authorizes alternative methods of electing school district governing board members, including at-large, hybrid, and by-trustee area elections;

**WHEREAS**, on August 23, 2021, EGUSD submitted a proposal to the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization (County Committee) under Education Code section 5019 to, effective for the November 8, 2022 election, change its election method so one board member residing within each trustee area will be elected by the registered voters residing in that trustee area ("by-trustee area" elections).

**WHEREAS**, EGUSD's proposal and public website and other publicly available information indicate the following history, public hearings, outreach, and other events related to EGUSD's proposed change of election method:

- 1959 EGUSD was created through a unification process. Seven trustee areas were established to ensure representation of the prior merged school districts.
- 2011 EGUSD last updated its trustee areas map to equalize population within its seven trustee areas.
- December 17, 2019 EGUSD adopted Resolution No. 32, 2019-20 to initiate a transition to a by-trustee area election system commencing with the November 2022 governing board election. At that time, EGUSD intended to wait until the release of the 2020 census data, then scheduled for March 2021, to begin the transition process.
- May 4, 2021 Due to COVID-19 pandemic-related delays in releasing the 2020 census data, the potential for further delay, the tight timelines to complete the process for 2022 elections, and EGUSD's aspiration for a robust public input process, EGUSD decided to immediately move forward to change to by-trustee area elections. Therefore, EGUSD adopted Resolution No. 67, 2020-21, reaffirming its intent to transition to "by-trustee area" elections using 2010 census data and to make any necessary adjustments to its trustee areas to ensure appropriate population balance after the 2020 census data is released.

- May 4, 2021 and May 18, 2021 EGUSD held public hearings to consider community input and comment regarding potential trustee area boundaries.
- May 18, 2021 EGUSD adopted Resolution No. 72, 2020-2021 authorizing the district to seek a waiver from the State Board of Education regarding electorate approval of the proposed change from at-large to by-trustee area elections.
- June 8, 2021 EGUSD published three (3) potential trustee area maps.
- June 15, 2021 and July 20, 2021 EGUSD held public hearings to gather public input on the proposed election method change, trustee-area maps, and sequence of elections.
- December 13-17, 2019 and April 30-August 19, 2021 EGUSD conducted extensive community outreach and provided public notice of EGUSD's public hearings, proposed election method change, potential maps, and process through multiple communications, public agenda notifications, newspaper and social media (Twitter, Instagram, Facebook) postings, EGUSD website postings, emails to all district staff, parents/guardians, and community members in EGUSD's system, consultations with EGUSD's seven labor organizations, and consultation with the District Advisory Committee and English Language Advisory Committee.
- August 10, 2021 EGUSD held public hearing and adopted Resolution No. 10, 2021-22 proposing to transition to "by-trustee area" elections using the currently existing EGUSD trustee area boundaries map and sequence of elections.
- September 9-10, 2021 State Board of Education to hear EGUSD's request to waive Education Code requirement that proposed election method changes be submitted to school district voters for approval or denial.

**WHEREAS**, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, California Governor Executive Order N-08-21 currently allows local legislative bodies to satisfy public transparency requirements by holding meetings via teleconference, subject to the requirements set forth in the Executive Order, and notwithstanding any other provision of state or local law;

**WHEREAS**, on September 9, 2021, as required by Education Code section 5019, and after having complied with all notice requirements, the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization (County Committee) conducted a public hearing via Zoom video and/or audio teleconference on EGUSD's proposal to change to by-trustee area elections;

**WHEREAS**, notice of the County Committee's video and/or audio teleconference hearing was posted on the EGUSD and Sacramento County Office of Education websites.

**WHEREAS**, EGUSD has submitted information in support of its proposal to change its election method to "by-trustee area" elections, the record reflects rational reasons for EGUSD's proposal, and EGUSD's proposal appears to be consistent with the law.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that:

- 1. The recitals set forth above are correct and true.
- 2. The Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization hereby approves EGUSD's proposal to:
  - a. Transition to by-trustee area elections, implementing EGUSD's existing seven trustee area boundaries map.
  - b. Maintain the current sequence of elections for EGUSD's seven trustee areas as follows:
    - i. Trustee Areas 2, 4, and 5 scheduled for election in 2022; and
    - ii. Trustee Areas 1, 3, 6, and 7 scheduled for election in 2024.
- 3. EGUSD shall submit the change in method of electing governing board members, trustee areas boundary map, sequence of elections, and any other required information to the appropriate county elections officials, and to all other necessary parties by all required deadlines.
- 4. The Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization hereby authorizes the Sacramento County Superintendent of Schools or designee to take any other actions needed to effectuate the purposes of this resolution.

**PASSED AND ADOPTED** by the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization this 9th day of September 2021, following a legally authorized public hearing, by the following vote:
