The History

- ♦ **May 2000:** ACLU and other public interest advocates filed lawsuit against the State of California
- ♦ **August 2004:** Settlement reached with Governor Schwarzenegger
- ♦ **September 2004:** Governor signed 5 bills to implement settlement
- ♦ **2005-2007:** Five additional bills passed, multiple regulations adopted

Williams Settlement

- Built on existing process and procedures
 - County Superintendent's examination of schools in the county and enforcement of the course of study and use of adopted instructional materials
 - Uniform Complaint Procedure
 - Commission on Teacher Credentialing reporting of credentialing and misassignments

Williams Implementation Information 2010-11

- Every three years, the list of schools eligible for review is updated and the 2010-2011 school year created a new list.
- Charter schools have a choice to "Opt In." No charters opted in the last time.
- QEIA schools must be reviewed regardless of Decile ranking.
- Two district orientation meetings were conducted to inform members of district teams about the Williams legislative requirements.
 - June 21, 2010 and July 7, 2010
- Two SCOE staff trainings were conducted
 - June 25, 2010 and August 3, 2010

New API Rankings

- ♦ The law requires the use of the same date API Rankings for three years.
- ♦ The 2006 rankings have previously been used.
- ♦ The 2009 rankings released May 2010 are being used for the new cohort. This has resulted in:
 - ♦ 2 new districts
 - ♦ 22 additional schools

2010-2011 Reviews

- Nine of the Sacramento County's 13 school districts have schools in the bottom one-third (Deciles 1-3) of schools statewide
- Instructional Materials Reviews: 91 schools
 - Six schools are also QEIA schools
- Facilities Reviews: 91 schools

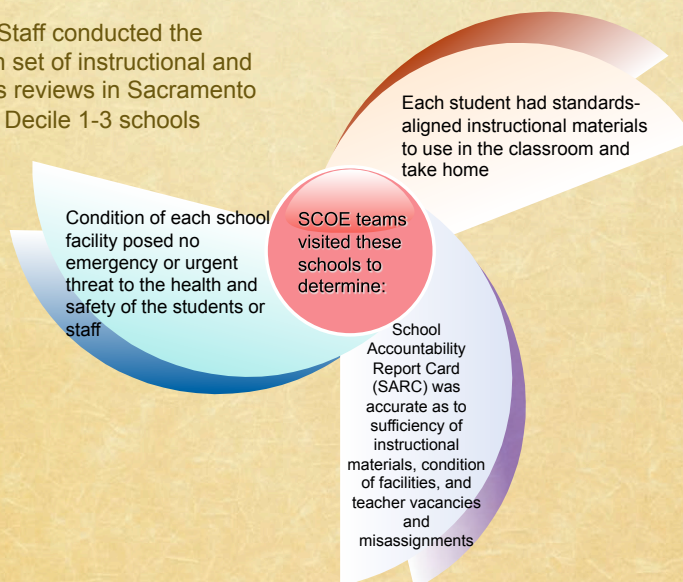

RESULTS

Sufficiency of Instructional Materials

- One school was found to have insufficient materials and was resolved after 5 business days

Condition of School Facilities

- No schools with emergency or urgent threats to health and safety
- 30 of 91 schools found to be in exemplary condition
- 53 of 91 schools found to be in good condition
- 6 schools found to be in fair condition
- 2 schools found to be in poor condition

Results: Teacher Vacancies and Misassignments

- SCOE Human Resources staff worked with districts to collect data on teacher vacancies
- “Vacancy” definition:
 - A position to which single-designated certificated employee has not been assigned within the first 20 school days of the year or semester
- Vacancies at “Williams” decile 1-3 schools were reviewed from 9 districts
 - 1 district had 6 vacancies representing 10 classes
- Misassignments data collected over course of year is reported to the Commission on Teacher Credentialing on July 1 of each year

Results: Summary of Uniform Complaints (UCP)

- First quarter of 2010-2011 school year
 - UCP complaints remain low and are being resolved in an expeditious manner
- Only two districts reported filed complaints
 - Both are condition of facilities complaints
- Both of the facilities complaints have been resolved
