Spring 2024 Student Performance Overview English Language Arts in Sacramento County

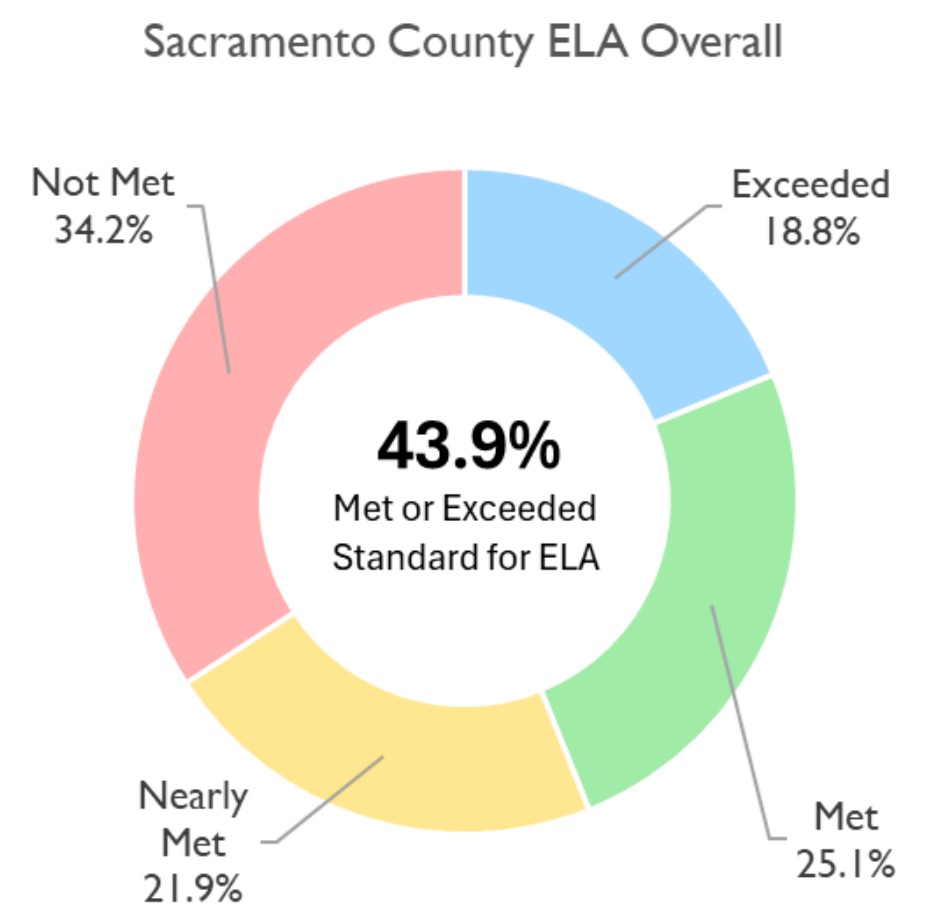
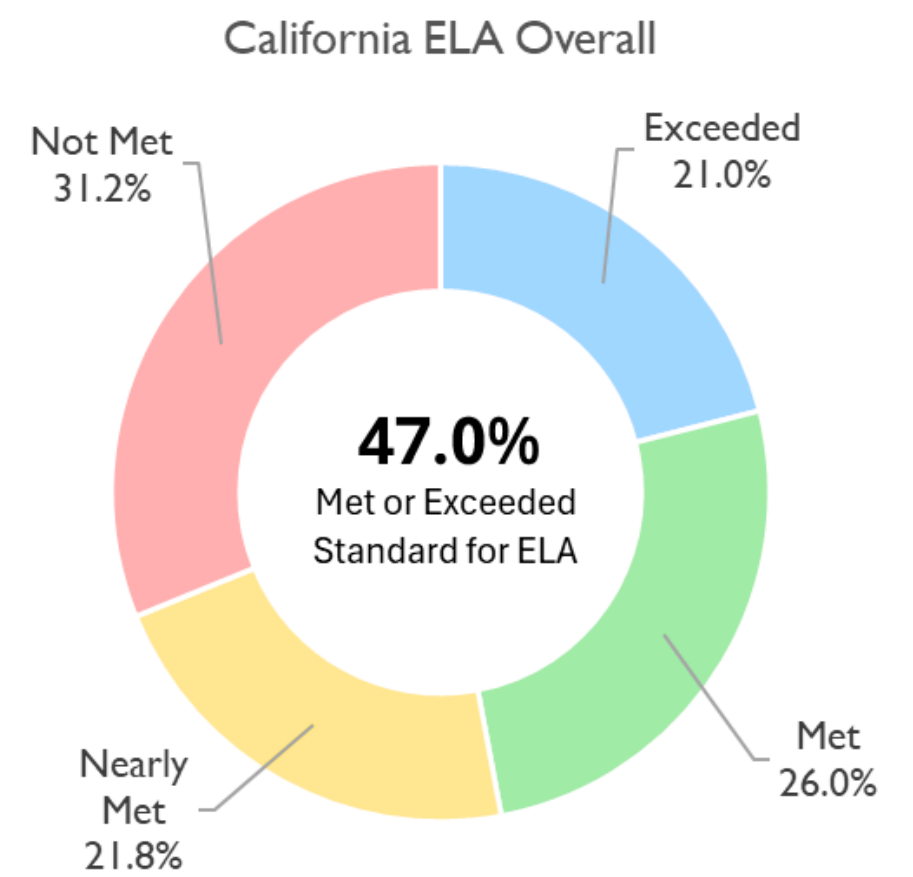


All students in grades 3–8 and 11 take the state tests in English language arts (ELA) and math. These tests are called the Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments and are a part of the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) system. The CAASPP is designed to help teachers, students, and families understand what students know and can do, and to help students prepare for college and careers.

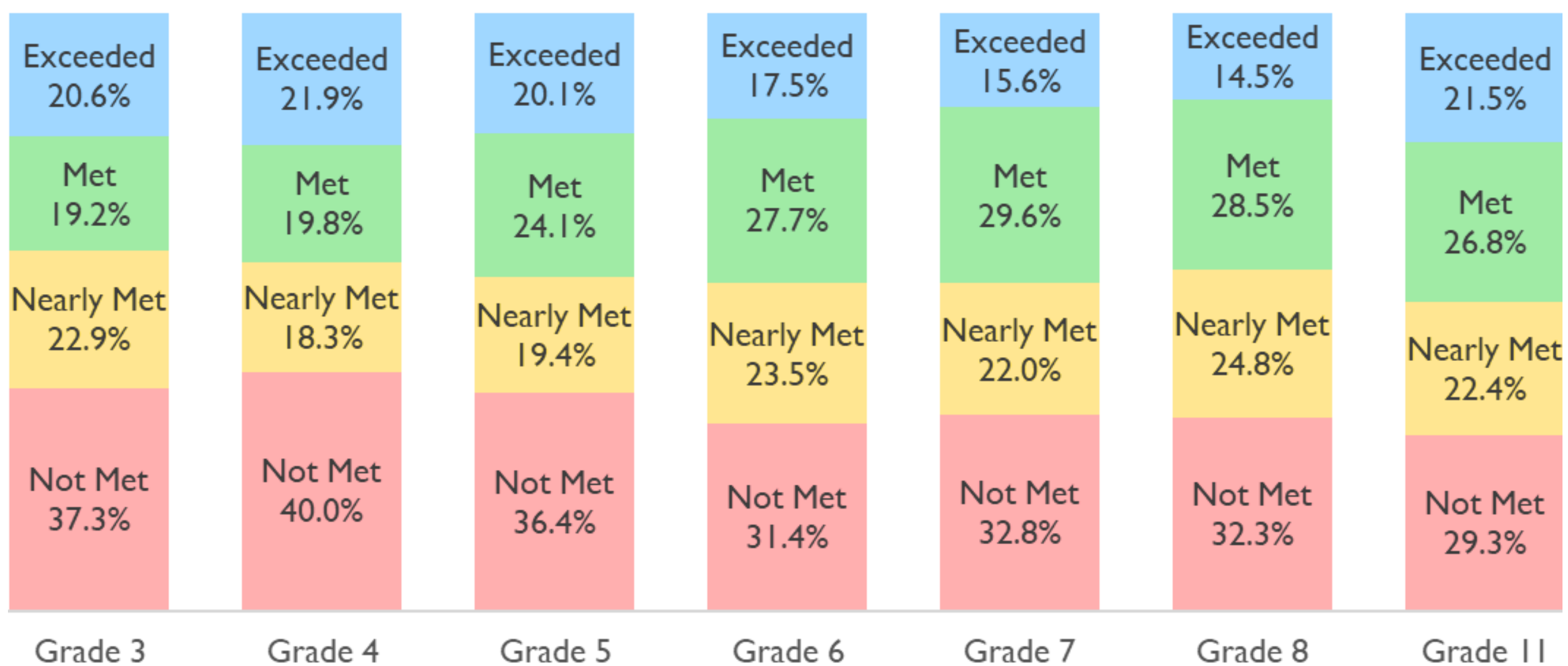
What do the scores mean? Students receive an overall score and an achievement level. There are four different achievement levels:

- Level 4: Standard Exceeded
- Level 3: Standard Met
- Level 2: Standard Nearly Met
- Level 1: Standard Not Met

In Sacramento County, 43.9% of students have met or exceeded the ELA performance standards for their grade level. The goal for all students is to reach the Standard Met or Standard Exceeded level, which means they met the expectations for their grade level.
