DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Assesses staff development needs and identifies progress regarding Secondary School Mathematics staff development programs for Sacramento County and Region 3 districts/schools for both core and intervention students; plans, designs, implements, and delivers staff development training programs and activities for educators working with core and intervention students based on needs assessment; meets with district administrators and conducts site visits as needed; establishes meeting/training agendas; coordinates facilities and room scheduling for trainings; researches and monitors current district practices, math curriculum/materials and policies; provides consultation and assistance to districts; consults with statewide agencies regarding mathematics curriculum issues; disseminates and updates information regarding mathematics curriculum, including state board adopted texts for relevant grade levels, and staff development programs; supervises, and evaluates staff as assigned.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education, Training, and Experience

Possession of a valid California Standard Secondary or Single Subject Mathematics teaching credential based on a bachelor's degree and student teaching; experience teaching mathematics at secondary grade levels required; extensive experience in mathematics curriculum; experience coordinating and implementing staff development programs; successful supervisory experience.

Knowledge of statewide mathematics curriculum frameworks, standards, assessments, and state board adopted texts at the identified grade level; effective communication skills in oral and written form; ability to effectively transmit knowledge and skill to staff; knowledge and skills to plan, develop, and conduct staff development activities and training programs; supervise and manage the work activities of a highly technical staff; skills to develop measurable goals and objectives, set priorities, monitor expenditures and evaluate progress toward achievement; interpersonal skills necessary to work cooperatively and effectively with individuals and groups.
